Aberdeen Mill built in 1774 as a 3 story mill, rebuilt around 1900, operated until 2002. www.aberdeenmills.com.

Mascot Roller Mill built in the mid-1730s, enlarged 1820, transferred in 1865 to William Ressler for three generations of family ownership. Adjacent Ressler Family Home overlooks Mill Creek. Fully operational water powered mill uses turbines and roller mill equipment. www.resslermill.com

Bowmansville Mill is a fully functioning water-powered grist mill and sawmill with both stones and roller mill equipment. www.bowmansvillemill.com

Landis Valley Museum (Lunch) collects, preserves, and interprets the history and material culture of the Pennsylvania German rural community from 1740 to 1940 www.landisvalleymuseum.org

FRIDAY October 13: York County Mills (8:15 Buses load at Wyndham Garden)

Wallace-Cross Mill 1826 custom grain mill with an overshot water wheel includes three floors of interpretive displays and historic artifacts.

Muddy Creek Forks Roller Mills built in 1847 and enlarged for roller milling in 1890; now preserved as part of the Ma & Pa Railroad Heritage Village. Tour includes 1899 A. M. Grove Store and a trip through the scenic Muddy Creek Valley on a motor car train. www.MaAndPaRailroad.com

New Park Wind Engine features two rare open-geared Aermotor power mills used on more prosperous farms at the turn of the 20th century to grind feed, cut fire wood, shell corn and other light chores. www.newparkwindengine.com

Eden Mill has the intact dam on Deer Creek and 3 generations of milling equipment. In 1917 The Fawn Grove Light and Power Company bought the mill and converted it to a power plant. The generators remain. www.edenmillmuseum.org
